REMIX 1: Old and New Acquisitions from the Permanent Collection

September 11, 2010 through December 23, 2010

WINTER PARK, FL – The Cornell Fine Arts Museum at Rollins College announces the opening of *REMIX 1: Old and New Acquisitions from the Permanent Collection*. Featuring a selection of works, all acquired by the Cornell Fine Arts Museum over the last year, installed with selected older works from the collection, *REMIX* follows *Wonderful and Curious*, shown this past spring in honor of the College's 125th Anniversary which highlighted the origins of the museum's permanent collection.

With this installment, *REMIX* aims to increase the scope of the museum's collections and develop creative ways of both presenting contemporary art exhibitions and highlighting the interplay between different art historical periods and across cultures.

On view will be works by Richard Anuszkiewicz, Martin Denker, Sam Gilliam and Lorna Simpson among others, all of which reflect the great diversity of pieces being acquired by the Cornell which now includes a concern for new media, installation and collaborative efforts. "By adding significant contemporary works to the collection, in tandem with a program of new contemporary art initiatives, the Cornell and its collections remain particularly alive, and relevant to our diverse audiences," said Scott Habes, the newly appointed Bruce A. Beal director of the Cornell Fine Arts Museum. "We have an exciting opportunity to consider what works and artists will be of particular relevance and interest not only to our audiences now, but also in the future," said Habes. "In this ongoing exhibition series, *REMIX*, we begin exploring these possibilities. Moreover, the quality, richness, and depth of the Cornell's collections allow us a

multitude of opportunities to bring our old collections and new acquisitions together to contextualize contemporary art and to spur new insights about the museum's collection.”
