



## Standardized Test Information for Graduate School Admission

### **G.R.E.**

As of October 1, 2002, the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) General Test will be composed of verbal, quantitative, and analytical writing sections. The verbal and quantitative sections will be unchanged from their present content. The analytical writing section is identical to the stand-alone test called the *Writing Assessment* that was introduced in October 1999.

### Special Accommodations:

Applicants may apply to take the GRE with special accommodations directly to the Educational Testing Center prior to arranging the test date. At that time, individuals seeking to take the GRE with special accommodations will be asked to provide official documentation for the special accommodation. The approval process takes a minimum of three weeks.

### **General Knowledge Test**

The General Knowledge Test is a new test developed to replace the College Level Academic Skills Test (CLAST), which was a State-mandated test required of all individuals seeking a Master of Arts in Teaching Elementary Education or certification to teach Elementary and Secondary grade levels. ### **Miller Analogies Test**

No prep courses are available for the MAT. However, books are available for review at a local bookstore or the public library, such as Princeton's *Cracking the MAT*; Harcourt Brace's *How to Prepare for the MAT*; and Cliff's *MAT Preparation Guide*.
