ROLLINS PLAN CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The Global Challenges: Florida and Beyond Plan offers an interdisciplinary approach using the Florida experience to examine broader political, economic, social, and environmental issues. The curriculum focuses on Rollins' legacy of engaged scholarship and learning, providing a broad, pragmatic liberal arts general education. This is the foundation for the sequence of courses that students will take over their four years of study. The seven course program explores global challenges through Florida's past, present, and future. Each semester, students will participate in two co-curricular activities involving community engagement and attend two campus or community lectures related to Florida or Global issues.

I. Students must demonstrate competency in writing, a foreign language, essential mathematics, and the physical education requirement.
