ROLLINS PLAN CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

Revolutionary ideas and events are crucial to human survival and determine who we are and who we become. By studying revolutions and revolutionary thought, students explore the past, engage the present, and envision the future. Integrating the arts, humanities, sciences, and social sciences, students master the skills, ideas and intellectual practices essential for an involved and educated citizen. The Revolution Program includes a variety of courses that span the liberal arts. Of these, students must successfully complete a minimum of seven courses, which include the introductory course, a capstone course, four courses within the disciplines, and one elective course prior to the capstone course.

I. Students must demonstrate competency in writing, a foreign language, essential mathematics, and the physical education requirement.
