

How to Get Started

1. Locate the post-print version of your work.
What is a post-print?

POST-PRINT

A post-print is the final version of the paper before journal formatting has been added. The post-print has been through the peer review process, officially accepted, and sent to the journal for publication. In other words, the post-print has the finalized content but not the finalized typeset.

2. Create a free account on scholarship.rollins.edu using your Rollins.edu email address. You'll receive a confirmation email within minutes.

3. Complete the online submission form and upload your content in only 5 easy steps.
An administrator will let you know when your content is available on RSO.
