

Repeat Visits

 Some students choose to use our services just at key points of need, but many integrate their sessions with a tutor into

their learning throughout the semester. This spring, more than half of the students who visited the TWC met with a tutor multiple times.

What was new in spring 2021?

- We created a digital guide to scheduling a tutoring appointment in order to address changes in the EAB scheduling interface.
- * We added our tutors' pronouns to their <u>bio statements on our website</u>.
- * We continued to pilot a Course Liaison position.

Post-Visit Survey

We received 74 responses to our post-visit survey (which is sent to all students who meet with a tutor each week).



94% of respondents indicated that they learned something during their session that they will use in the future. Respondents also tended to leave their session feeling more confident and encouraged in their academic work.


BEFORE my visit to the TWC I felt (select all that apply): HOPEFUL, CONFUSED, NERVOUS










AFTER my visit to the TWC I felt (select all that apply): ENCOURAGED, RELIEVED, CONFIDENT

Number of Appointment Requests (submitted through EAB Navigate): 83

- Why do students submit appointment requests?
 O They cannot find an available appointment at a time that works for their schedule.
 - O They want to schedule an appointment sooner than 18 hours in advance.
 - We do not have a tutor in place for their course.
- Appointment requests were roughly half of what they were in fall 2020, and cancellations were down by more than 20%. This data suggests that we have continued our trend of connecting students with our peer tutoring services more effectively and efficiently, despite the range of challenges posed by the global pandemic this semester.

Workshops

During the fall 2020 semester, TWC administrators and peer tutors facilitated **10 workshops and class visits** in a range of courses including RCCs, RFLAs, ENGW, ANT, ENV, and POL.

Workshop topics included:

- Getting the Most out of TWC Services
- * Citing and Using Sources Effectively
- Revision and the Writing Process
- Guided Peer Review

As we look toward fall 2021, we will continue to:

- * Offer virtual tutoring among our range of peer tutoring services.
 - Continuing to offer a virtual tutoring option will allow us to support students in the Holt program and others for whom accessing on-campus tutoring is an obstacle.
- Partner with faculty and staff in order to support student learning across campus.
- Expand professionalization opportunities for our student staff in order to prepare them for responsible leadership, meaningful lives, and productive careers.
